To cite a book in a reference entry in APA style 6th edition include the following elements: Author(s) of the book: Give the last name and initials (e. g. Watson, J. D.) of up to seven authors with the last name preceded by an ampersand (&). For eight or more authors include the first six names followed by an ellipsis (...) and add the last author's name.

The sixth edition provides explicit rules for direct quotations and states that you must credit the source when “ paraphrasing, quoting an author directly, or describing an idea that influenced your work ” (p. 170). If the quotation is less than 40 words, incorporate the quotation into the text and place quotation marks round the quotation.

If the book or chapter you are citing lists a DOI, include it at the end of your reference in place of the publisher information, without a period. Cite the edition of the book you used. If there aren ' t multiple editions of the book, or if it isn ' t a multivolume work, then do not include this information in your reference.

Your reference list should include the edition of the book that you read and are relying on for your information. You need to include references to more than one edition only if you read two or more editions of the same book and are using information from each one in your paper.

Citing a Book in APA | Citation Machine

Basic book citation format. The APA in-text citation for a book includes the author ' s last name, the year, and (if relevant) a page number. In the reference list, start with the author ' s last name and initials, followed by the year. The book title is written in sentence case (only

capitalize the first word and any proper nouns). Include any other contributors (e.g. editors and translators) and the edition if specified (e.g. " 2nd ed. " ).
